Javanne does not disclose names and addresses of its suppliers. → It is time for Javanne to go transparent! A first step should be to comply with the Transparency Pledge, and publish data in a machine-readable format.

LIVING WAGE PAID:



This means: Javanne makes no claim and no public evidence was found that its suppliers are paying a living wage. → Javanne should respect the right of workers in its supply chain to a living wage and ensure full transparency in order to demonstrate the implementation of a real living wage at factory level.



Javanne has made no commitment that we can find to ensure a living wage is paid across its supplier network.



No evidence was found that Javanne takes steps to safeguard wages when they are in price negotiations with suppliers. This allows suppliers to put profit margins ahead of wage security for workers.

Several benchmarks are available for companies to measure whether wages are sufficient to meet the basic needs of workers and their families.

However, no evidence was found that the company uses any credible living wage benchmark.

Javanne does not publicly report on unionization of workers nor on existing collective bargaining agreements in its supplier factories.

Javanne should commit publicly to ensuring a living wage is paid across its supply chain.

Javanne should commit to a published plan describing how a living wage will be achieved in a reasonable time-frame.

Javanne should isolate labour from other production costs, so its suppliers do not cut wages in order to negotiate lower prices.

No evidence was found of public information on gender pay gaps in its supply chain.

No data about wages currently paid to workers at its suppliers is disclosed.
